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
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Student and Experiential Impact



This conference would turn out to be one of the most transformative experiences of my university career and I will always be grateful for the wealth of knowledge, skills, and connections I was able to gain from this experience. Throughout the conference, I attended various workshops, panel discussions, and networking sessions that covered everything from leadership

development to career advancement, to simple advice on navigating common situations and experiences in the business world. I gained exposure to so many diverse perspectives from incredible women who I otherwise might never encounter. They taught me strategies for navigating challenges.
